A RESOLUTION TO CENSURE

Arizona State Representative Ben Toma, as Speaker of the House and
Arizona State Senator Warren Petersen, as President of the Senate for Their Joint
Failure and Refusal to Perform Their Sworn Duties to Model Arizona Law in such
a Way as to Protect Arizonans' Election Integrity, and to Do the Will of Their
Republican Constituents.

Whereas, it is well established that Katie Hobbs in her official capacity as Secretary of State, personally supervised her own 2022 election to the Governor's Office rather than recuse herself from that supervision, and whereas, since assuming the post of Governor she has vetoed against the better interests of the Citizens of the State of Arizona, more than 20 fiscally and morally responsible bills including the **2023 budget**, but especially including her veto of the election integrity bills: 1. Hobbs vetoed Senate Bill S.B.1070, which requires illicit drugs, terrorists, gangs, and illegal aliens to be identified and dealt with according to the laws of Arizona and of the United States. 2. Hobbs vetoed Senate Bill, S.B. 1074, which required tabulation machines (such as the controversial "Dominion Machines") to be manufactured in the United States to meet or exceed security standards required by the Department of Defense. Hobbs wrote, "**The election equipment required by the bill, as well as the problem it purports to solve, does not exist.**" 3. Hobbs also vetoed Arizona House Bill H.B.2415 renovating our decades-out-of-date early balloting voter rolls. 4. Hobbs vetoed House Bill 2322 Ballot signature verification standards, which *must* occur as *signature verification* is currently out of control and is being done by election department employees without partisan oversight. Signature verification is the lynchpin of election integrity and is an important choke point for free, fair, and legitimate elections. The April 6th Veto was surprising because 16 of 29 Democratic Representatives voted for H.B. 2322. It even included a change sought by Rep. Laura Terech (D-Phoenix). Without proper and honest signature verification, there is no particular control over any ballot that makes it into an early voting ballot box, regardless of its geographical location. Proper signature verification benefits all Arizona Citizens regardless of political party. Hobbs retorted that, "The standards in this bill are already several years old" and they are better addressed in a separate election procedures manual." Yet Hobbs statement is false. Katie Hobbs installed and supervised this past election using a "procedures manual" written and approved by her staff and herself. And, whereas, during the 2020 election, Hobbs together with the County Supervisors contracted at least two Dominion Voting Machine employees to manage their Dominion tabulation equipment/software as well as the Maricopa County Election Department employees who tabulated the votes as well as coaching and adjudicating questions about the tabulation brought by bipartisan observers and workers.

Whereas, Katie Hobbs cannot or will not acknowledge and move to correct election integrity and these crises of confidence; and,

Whereas, the Arizona Legislature controls the budget of the State of Arizona and of the Governor's Office; and

Whereas, Representative Ben Toma in his leadership role will not promote the defunding of the Governor's Office until such a time when Katie Hobbs in her role as governor can be pressured by Arizona Citizens to both acknowledge and help to correct this state's election fraud problems and crises of confidence; and

Whereas, Senator Warren Petersen in his leadership role as President of the Senate has been repeatedly warned by registered mail and by email to bring the People's Will to bear on this problem but will not promote defunding of the Governor's Office until such a time as Katie Hobbs in her role as governor can be pressured by Arizona Citizens to both acknowledge and help to correct this state's election fraud problems and crisis of confidence; and

Whereas, during a phone call with AZGOP Executive Member-at-Large Christian Lamar of December 3rd, 2022, Senator Warren Petersen did refuse to support his constituents in obtaining critical access to the 2022 Election signature verification envelopes and adjudication. He also refused to consider a revote of the controversial 2022 state election; and,

Whereas, in response to threats of censure, Republican AZ State Senate President Warren Petersen telephoned AZGOP Executive Member-at-Large Christian Lamar on February 15th 2023. Senator Petersen was being threatened with censure because he would use neither his State nor his Federal authority to compel Arizona Counties to follow Arizona Election Law, by tying the County's state-shared revenue to the compliance of the AZ election law. Though upset by threats of censure, Petersen was asked directly “. . . What is your solution to this problem?“ Senator Petersen did not answer. A second time he was asked, and this time Senator Petersen simply hung up the phone, ending the call.

Whereas, on January 1st, January 14th, and February 1st, Warren Petersen did receive notice of, and orders to defund the Governor's Office, (but not critical infrastructure) until such a time as the Arizona Supreme Court would Hear and Rule on the legality of Katie Hobbs as Secretary of State supervising her own election as Governor, the refusal of Courts to hear and rule on the complaint of Maricopa County Supervisors absolute refusal to comply with several court orders to cooperate with the 2020 election audit regarding access to the inner workings of the Dominion voting machines, etc., as per their legislative responsibilities; and,

Whereas, the Arizona Legislature has control of all disbursements of money from the State Treasury by the authority of Arizona Revised Statutes §Article 9, Sections 5 through 20; and, §Article 42-5029, D; and,

RESOLUTION

Legislative District ____ of Congressional District ____ RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS: **Ben Toma, as Leader of the Arizona House of Representatives;** and, **Warren Petersen, as President of the Arizona Senate,** are hereby rebuked and censured with a vote of no-confidence and do forfeit the social, political, and financial support of their Republican Constituency. This forfeiture shall remain in place until such a time as they realize and correct their errors by bringing all the financial might that civil and criminal law affords their sworn public offices to defund the Governor’s Office until the Governor acknowledges and acts to correct election fraud and in favor of the Citizens of the State of Arizona .
